## TRAFFIC CONTROL OVERVIEW - MARCH 2015

### **Weekday mornings (6 to 8 a.m. currently\*)**

Weekday flagging and pilot car operations currently begin between 6 and 6:30 a.m. There are currently three flagging stations - one on the west end of the corridor on the Glen Haven side, one on the east end of the corridor on the Drake side and one at the bottom of Dunraven Glade. As crews prepare for the day's activities and start moving equipment into place, flaggers will release any waiting traffic at 6:35 a.m. During this timeframe, wait times should be no more than 30 minutes.

### **Weekdays (8 a.m. to 4 p.m. currently)**

During this time frame, drivers should plan for up to 1 hour delays. Pilot cars will escort drivers through both construction zones once an hour at five minutes after the hour\*\* beginning at 8:05 a.m. The two pilot cars – one at the west construction zone on the Glen Haven side and one at the east construction zone on the Drake side – both depart from their respective flagging stations at the same time. It takes several minutes for the pilot cars to make their way through both construction zones and people waiting at the bottom of Dunraven Glade or Streamside Drive should fall in behind the last car being escorted in the direction they want to travel.

### **Weekday evenings (4 to 6 p.m. currently)**

During this time frame, traffic will be released at 5 minutes after the half-hour. For example, traffic releases will occur at 4:05, 4:35, 5:05 and 5:35.

### **Saturdays**

On Saturdays there may be 1-hour delays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. with pilot cars leading vehicles at five minutes after the hour. From 6 to 8 a.m. and 4 to 6 p.m., there could be up to 30-minute delays throughout the corridor when crews are working.

### **Overnight hours (6 p.m. to 6 a.m. currently)**

During the overnight hours, traffic signals are used as necessary to control the flow of traffic through one-lane sections of roadway. The wait time at these signals should be no more than about six minutes. Anyone who notices the signals are malfunctioning should call the project hotline at 800-536-4403 and relay this information to the operator so the project team can address it immediately.

*\*\*Vehicles will only be allowed to pass through the construction zones when the road is safe to travel. If additional work needs to be done to ensure the public's safety, pilot cars will delay their departure time.*
